What is Easter? Have you ever thought about it? Is Easter chocolate and bunnies? Is Easter a time to get together with your families? Really what is Easter? Sometimes we lose sight of the fact that Easter is a celebration of the Lord's resurrection. It is easy to lose site of the magnitude of this event. For Peter and the other apostles this was not an allegory, metaphor or some theological examination. It was a real even beyond all hope.

Jesus Christ is not a figure in your head. Jesus Christ is the living son of God who redeemed us of our sins through his blood. The apostles knew Jesus however, they did not appreciate fully who he was despite their time with him. They had not surrendered fully to the divine mystery. When Jesus asked Peter to pray that he may not undergo the test, Jesus knew Peter's strength was not enough. Peter failed to pray sufficiently so Jesus prayed in his place as he does for all of us.

Peter like the rest of the apostles abandoned Jesus. They were sure that their sin, their failings throughout their lives and on the night of Jesus' arrest was the end of all. What was there left? Perhaps they thought the only thing left was for God to punish them. However, when Jesus rose from the dead He stood in their midst and said, "Peace be with you."

We don't have sufficient awe for the resurrection. It reminds me of a scene from Lord of the Rings where Sam loses consciousness believing he was witnessing the end of everything. When he awakes, he found himself alive, along with Frodo and his dreams coming true. It is so unbelievable to him that he exclaims, "Gandalf! I thought that you were dead! But then I thought I was dead myself. Is everything sad going to come untrue? What's happened to the world?" J.R.R. Tolkien, the author of the Lord of the Rings, was Catholic. What he describes through the words of Samwise Gamgee are a glimmer of the resurrection. It is so beyond our expectation that it seems unreal.

The joy of Easter is learning that truly is real, that that He has the last word and not our sin. There are no words to fully describe such an experience, but Sam's words give us a glimpse. The real Easter experience is the one God brings about in your own heart that is also difficult to believe or explain.

What is Easter to you? The celebration of Easter is a reminder that evil does not get the last word. Not only this, but God's restoration is greater than what is lost. It should be no surprise that this is difficult for us to comprehend. It was also difficult for the apostles to believe as we witness in the apostles throughout the Easter season. Jesus must repeatedly appear in their midst to teach them, giving them his peace and even assure them he was not a ghost. In the end, they require the Holy Spirit to assist their poor humanity. We are not orphans who have to do everything alone. We do not have to be strong enough. We must be weak enough to accept Jesus' help, as Jesus was weak enough to abandon Himself to the Father's will.

What is Easter to me? What words can encompass all the good God has done in my life especially in the times when I deserved to have my sin have the last word. Easter is the surprising truth of just how much God loves us. It is the surprising truth of how much God loves me. My sin does matter. It does have consequence, and I fear at times that it will have the last word. Easter is to me a reminder that only God has the last word.

I don't know about you, but my faults; the mistakes I make, the sins I commit are many. They distress me greatly and I spend a great deal of time expecting them to have the last word. Throughout His resurrection appearances, however, Jesus reminds us that we are loved. We are God's own. He paid dearly for us knowing our faults and failing. It is this fact which draws us near to him. Who would not want to be with someone who loved them as much as to do what Jesus did? We could say Jesus is a terrible investor. He puts his money in all the worst investments and yet he turns these rags into riches. We may be all rags in our sin, but Jesus sees us as we are, sons and daughters of the King. He does not rest from his labor until we experience this truth intensely in our hearts. God has a plan for us, even amid a broken and sinful world. Let us ponder what is in store for us as revealed by Jesus in the resurrection.
