Good Shepherd Sunday

"I am the Good Shepherd," Jesus says in the gospel reading this Sunday. This Sunday is known as "Good Shepherd Sunday" because of this reading. It is a day when we pray for vocations to the priesthood, for priests and other vocations. What is <u>the priesthood</u>? St. John Vianney says that "The priesthood is the love of the heart of Jesus." This is because of Jesus more than the priesthood. The priesthood does not belong to us, it belongs to Jesus, and we participate through Him. Good Shepherd Sunday is a reminder of God's gift to us of the priesthood and, the need to pray for good priests.

Who is a priest? We can see a glimmer of who a priest is through the Apostles receiving Jesus for 40 days. They fear. They were afraid of their sin. However, they came to know redemption. They came to know Jesus on a more intimate level and that He saved them. It was this experience of Jesus and not knowledge of the scriptures that brought about a change in the Apostles. In fact, Jesus had to open the scriptures for the Apostles to understand. Before the experience of God, they were closed to the authentic interpretation of scripture regarding the Messiah. All Christians are dependent upon God. We should say this even more of priests because of the exalted nature of a priest's vocation. It is not possible for a priest to fulfill his vocation by human means alone. If a priest depended on human means alone, he would be in danger of eternal damnation. "To whom much is given much is expected" (cf Luke 12:48).

Throughout her various apparitions, Mary reminds us to pray for priests. She also reminds us to pray for the Holy Father. One reason is that we require priests for the sacraments. We require priests to have the Holy Mass. We require priests to reach the level of sanctity God desires for us. Priests may help us get to heaven, but priests need our prayers too. They have grown up in the same culture and corruption as the rest of us. If we want God to renew the priesthood (I do), then we must offer prayer and sacrifice for priests. This includes especially priests we think are not up to the task.

Praying for priests can be difficult. So many priests have unfortunately wounded others. Sometimes this is through simple human failings, and sometimes through grave sin. I have my own share of such experiences. What moves me are two experiences. First a time when I prayed for a priest who scandalized me. The more I prayed for him the greater peace I felt. This priest has since died, and I still pray for him. I also ask God to allow him for help in my priesthood now in ways he was unable to because of his humanity when I was in the seminary. The second story that helps me pray for the church and for priests is the image of Peter admitting his denial of Jesus to Mary. There is a beautiful painting of it which I will never forget. Mary had a right to respond to Peter with anger. She had no sin, and yet she chose compassion in imitation of Jesus. Let us all pray to Mary and St. Joseph to learn how to intercede for the Church and receive healing for the wounds we have received, and the Church has received.

Priests and bishops need our prayers, but they can be held to account at the same time. We can respect their priesthood more than they do. Once in seminary I was unjustly scolded publicly by a priest. I could have been devastated or responded in anger. I prayed silently and God gave me the grace to forgive and remain in peace. I still pray for that priest today. Once, as a priest I was on the other side. A person felt offended by me when I had given them a sacrament. They were kind enough to point this out to me privately. I am grateful that they did so I could be aware of my offense and change. I cannot change the whole church or the hierarchy. I can change myself and offer prayer and sacrifice for the church.

The Easter season is a reminder that we are a people who live by faith. God even uses evil which we cannot avoid to serve our good. For example, the apostles were unjustly persecuted after the death of Jesus. When the Jewish officials put St. James the major to death it served to spread Christianity as Christians departed Jerusalem. This also had the effect of sparing Christians from the destruction of Jerusalem by the Romans. The martyrdom of St. James was evil, but God brought about good through it. Using our faith helps us to discern how to respond to the evils we encounter, and how to cooperate with God when we are unable to dislodge evil through our human efforts alone. We must learn to seek God in our circumstances and let the light of faith illuminate our lives.

On this Good Shepherd Sunday let us consider the mystery of God in the priesthood. Let us pray not only for vocations, but for a renewal in the priesthood. Let us ask God to reveal to us priests who live in a manner like Jesus. Let us remember the example of Holy Priests who have died and ask for their intercession for the church today. Let us also pray for priests who have died and were not stellar priests. This does good for their souls and the church today. I will leave you with one quote which summarizes why we need to pray for holiness in the priesthood. Once the devil said through a possessed person that "If there were three such priests as [St. John Vianney] my kingdom would be ruined." Would that we have three such priests. Would that we all, priests and people, fast and pray for such a mystery to be realized.
