Collection on Good Friday is for the Holy Land.

"The Lord God has opened my ear, and I was not rebellious, I turned not backward. I gave my back to those who struck me, and my cheeks to those who pulled out the beard; I hid not my face from shame and spitting." Isaiah 50:5-6

What is the message of God as we enter Holy Week? The message is not 'what.' The message is 'who.' The message is Jesus Christ. Before His witness, we do not find ourselves righteous. We find ourselves sinful. We find that Jesus suffers unjustly in our place. We find Jesus is willing to go the extra mile which we are not. The message is true, and it confronts our wrongdoing. It can seem too much and we want to run away, as did Peter and the other Apostles. Jesus, however, does not back down. Jesus chooses to suffer willingly for our sake. The question we must ask is, "What does this matter to us?"

This year we read the Passion from the gospel of Mark. The disciples were not ready, even though Peter proclaimed that he was (Mk 14:26-31). We should remember Jesus' words in the garden, "Pray that you may not undergo the test." Jesus' is sorrowful unto death and so he prays (v34). If Jesus must pray, ought we not also to pray? The disciples did not pray; they could not even keep their eyes open. It may be that the apostles displayed this weakness because they relied solely on their own strength. Jesus, though He was God, did not rely on His own strength. He humbled himself and relied solely on the Father.

In the 15th chapter of Mark, we find Jesus already arrested. He is questioned by Pilate, mocked and beaten by the soldiers and reviled by the Jews. Yet Jesus yields to no one but the Father. Ponder your Jesus standing before all these things. He does not yield, but he does feel the fear of death. Everything that Jesus does is in the will of God the Father. We may want to say that this is because Jesus is Himself God, but we must remember that Jesus also has a human nature. Jesus' human nature can feel fear and must be submitted to the will of God. Jesus' submission to God in the face of this fear of death overturns the fear which Adam gave into in the Garden when he was afraid of the devil. Jesus conquers fear through trust (in God) and love (of God and neighbor). The victory of Christ over sin is one that we can share in through faith and humility.

In order to win the victory for us, Jesus had to willingly suffer. Sometimes we sacralize this truth to suggest that it was not a really hard thing to do But consider whether you would willingly suffer smaller things. Would you choose to accept jury duty, choose not to get angry when someone cuts you off in traffic or accept a speeding ticket? If we could get out of these things, we would. Yet Jesus was unjustly condemned and made to suffer. He chose not only to endure these things, but to embrace them. There is a beautiful scene from Mel Gibson's The Passion of Christ which displays this. In the movie when Jesus receives the cross, He embraced the cross declaring, "I am your servant, Father..." One of the others who is to be crucified, mocks Jesus for this, saying, "Why do you embrace your cross, fool?" Jesus embraces the cross because He loves God and He loves us.

When Jesus is exposed for all to see, hanging on the cross in agony, He is mocked and derided for not taking himself down off of the cross. Can you imagine yourself in such agony, knowing that you can save yourself with only a word, and yet choosing to suffer? Jesus does. He feels the sense of abandonment that we do when we suffer. "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?" (Mk 15:34). He experiences this temptation, but he does not yield. Clearly, Jesus experiences agony to say such a thing. Yet at the same time his words expresses confidence in God. Jesus is quoting Psalm 22 when He asks God why He has been forsaken. The psalm begins with the same words Jesus utters from the cross but end with confidence in God. In Luke's gospel, we can observe an additional proof. There he hands over his spirit to God. Lastly, we have the witness of the centurion who observed Jesus' death. Witnessing Jesus' death he declares, "Truly this man was the Son of God." (v 40). The moment of salvation for this centurion was to see how willingly Jesus, an innocent man beaten, condemned and reviled, handed over his spirit.

It is essential for our salvation that we witness the Passion of Jesus. It is not enough to do this once at our conversion. We need to do this perpetually. This is why the church observes the Holy Mysteries each Lent. It is also why the church asks us to observe penance on Fridays throughout the year. It also is why the saints reflect so often on the Passion. May our journey with Jesus through Holy Week and our witness of the Lord's Passion change us as it changed the Centurion who proclaimed Jesus' divine Sonship.
