

Come Holy Spirit

"May the eyes of your hearts be enlightened, that you may know what is the hope that belongs to his call" Romans 5:5

During the time of Easter, Jesus appeared to the apostles and taught them. He addressed their woundedness; He helped them turn away from their weakness and then after His ascension into Heaven...He leaves them? This seems strange until you understand that by doing this, Jesus is leading them to new and deeper faith. However, the apostles stare at the sky after Jesus is taken from their sight until the angels instruct them that he will return. He also promised help from Heaven. We are not helpless. Jesus promises the necessary means to live the Christian message and to evangelize. Jesus tells us to wait for "the promise of the Father."

The apostles waited and prayed together in Cenacle with our Mary. Our Lady's presence was significant. We know from the gospel of Luke that Mary was overshadowed by the Holy Spirit, and full of grace (Lk1:34,28). It is not hard to imagine that she helped the apostles' prayer in anticipation of the Holy Spirit. Today we know that the apostles prayed for nine days, which is why it is called the first novena. "Novena" is derived from the Latin word for nine.

Jesus did not say to the apostles "pray for nine days." He told them to not depart from the city until the coming of the "promise of the Father." The apostles had to have faith that Jesus' promise would be fulfilled. They also did not know, who or what this "promise of the Father" was. They had to wait. They had to trust God with expectant faith. We also need to pray with expectation to God especially when our prayer leads us beyond what we can directly see or imagine.

Let us prayerfully await the coming of the Holy Spirit. It does not matter where you are on your spiritual journey. The Spirit comes to all, even if not all accept Him. When He comes, He convicts us of sin. We are all at fault for turning away from God and his commandments; the Spirit convicts us of this. He testifies that Jesus died for us without sin, and thus, he goes to the Father. He goes to prepare a place for us. The Spirit convicts us of judgment. It is the ruler of this world who is judged (Jn16:11). Finally, the Holy Spirit convicts us of righteousness, namely that of Jesus. We are righteous by faith in Jesus. Our hope, our life our everything is in Him.

How can we be convicted of sin and not judged? Now is not the time of our judgment. Jesus came not to condemn us, but to save us. At the same time, it is blameworthy to reject His message. Persistent denial will lead to condemnation with judgement does come. On the other hand, when we pray with expectant faith Jesus visits us. He comes even when we are mired in sin. Jesus frees us from "the ruler of the world." He has the solutions to our problems, especially the ones which perplex us, but it is up to us to follow the Spirit's promptings. The Holy Spirit came to the apostles hiding in the upper room, but when they had received the Spirit, they responded to the prompting to exit and preach to the 5,000. They did so without even understanding the language of the crowd. The Holy Spirit made up for their lack and all heard the message in their own language. It was a surprise that God could do such a thing.

My brothers and Sisters, the Holy Spirit is who we need. He comes to aid our human weakness. He points the way for us when we are lost. I implore you pray for the coming of the Holy Spirit into your own life.
