The scribes who had come from Jerusalem said, "He is possessed by Beelzebul," and "By the prince of demons he drives out demons." Mark 3:22

What is blasphemy? Have you ever thought about it? Does it really matter to you? It matters to God, but perhaps not in the way which you believe. God is never out to get us. On the other hand, the enemy of God is rightly called, "the accuser" for that is what he is and what he does. He accuses us night and day before God looking for a way to separate us (Revelations 12:10). Blasphemy is one of the ways that the accuser accomplishes our separation. When the Enemy so inspires a soul to blaspheme the devil, he at one time directly assaults God through the soul and separates the same soul from God. Blasphemy separates us from God and puts us in danger of eternal damnation, but this is not the will of God.

The scene for Jesus teaching on blasphemy against the Holy Spirit is a crowd which is stirred up. His "relatives" (the language in greek can also include disciples of Jesus), and the scribes are confused. His relatives note how the crowd presses upon them to the point that it is impossible for Jesus and those with Him to eat. They say that he is "out of his mind." The scribes take the opportunity to insert themselves. They say, Jesus, is "possessed by Beelzebub." The scribes seek to capitalize on the disciples' confusion to turn them against Jesus and overturn his teaching. This is essentially diabolical. Jesus responds by teaching them about blasphemy and in particular blasphemy against the Holy Spirit.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church defines blasphemy as: "uttering against God - inwardly or outwardly - words of hatred, reproach, or defiance; in speaking ill of God; in failing in respect toward him in one's speech; in misusing God's name" (CCC 2148). In other words, blasphemy is an attitude or assault against God or the things of God. I would add that it is also blasphemy to purposely undermine the things of God. Note, however, Jesus does NOT say that the sin of blasphemy is unforgivable, rather he says that blasphemy against the Holy Spirit is the unforgivable sin. This begs the question, "What is the difference?"

Blasphemy is a sin which undermines the work of God. For example, teaching children irreverent things about God undermines God's ability to speak to them. Another example, repeatedly presenting the priesthood negatively, not because of the facts of a news story, but to undermine the priesthood itself. A news story intends to review the facts. The purpose of a blasphemous drama about the priesthood is to impugn the priesthood. There is an explicit intention to manipulate away from God. However, even this sin does not preclude God from working in the soul of the blasphemer. The Saints have frequently been able to convert such men. Blasphemy against the Holy Spirit takes this sin to a whole new level.

From the parable it seems pretty clear that those who are blaspheming against the Holy Spirit are the scribes. What is their sin? Their sin is attributing to Satan, what is clearly an act of God. As Jesus demonstrates in his parable, casting out the devil is a work of God and is not in the interests of Satan. However, the scribes have not only closed there eyes and ears to the truth. They pervert the truth to representing evil as good or good as evil. The reason blasphemy is an unforgivable sin is not because of any lack in God, but instead, because the blasphemer refuses to receive anything from God. In fact, this attitude is similar to that of the fallen angels who say, "I will not serve" or as Satan says it in John Milton's poem Paradise Lost, "Better to reign in Hell than serve in Heaven." If someone adopts such an attitude how can they be saved? Is it God's fault? On the other hand, if such a sinner were to repent of his obstinacy before his death, then his sin can be forgiven.

After Jesus teaches about blasphemy, He responds to a question about his mother and relatives saying, "Here are my mother and my brothers. For whoever does the will of God is my brother and sister and mother." If we follow the will of God, then we will not be guilty of blasphemy against the Holy Spirit. Moreover, we will develop a virtue contrary to the sin. I would like to add this verse is not an attack against the Blessed Virgin because she is the one who most exemplifies this command. No other human does the will of God more perfectly than the Virgin Mary. Mary because of her perfect obedience to God is both an example and an effective means of obtaining the virtue of Holy Obedience to God's will.
