Called and sent

Who today considers the calling of God. St. Paul recognizes that God blesses us and that our Christian life is a response to God choosing us before we choose him. This is inversion of the modern tendency to make ourselves the center of all. God is the center, but he invites us to share in something great.

St. Paul blesses God because God first blesses us. God always makes the first move. He loves us long before he asks anything of us. For St. Paul this is why we bless God because he has done it for us first. This is analogous to a child who imitates their father. He wants to be like his dad. For St. Paul, God not only blesses us but destines us for great purposes in his holy will. This purpose is greater than anything we can achieve on our own.

Modernity over emphasizes choice because we believe that if we are the center of all, if we are the first mover then we will be free. However, the cost of trying to live this way is a loveless life. In order to live in love we must both give and receive it. This is true in God who is the source of life and love. The Holy Trinity is a communion of love which is given and received. God give and receives love in himself because without this God would be incomplete. God therefore seeks to share with us his own life.

Why does it disturb us that God loves us before we love him. Perhaps it reveals our shame, the sin of Adam present in us. Shame humbles us before God. However, the calling of God is that seeing our shame seeks to redeem us rather than remove us. In this way God reveals his love. There is no greater love than to be seen at your most vulnerable including your unsightly parts (spiritual and physical) and to be loved anyway.

Love demands a response. To continue to live in God's love requires that we respond to what is given. In St. Paul's example in Ephesians 1, Paul blesses God. Repentance is also required. Repentance is first the acceptance of God's grace. God sees my sin. God forgives my sin. God raises me from sin. How can we hope to live with God if our response to this is to then willingly to return to our sins. That is a betrayal of the love bestowed upon us. To live in love means to both give and receive it. To deny this is to live outside of love.

In the gospel, Jesus sends the apostles to proclaim the gospel. The gospel means the good news. The apostles share what God has done in them and desires to do in all of us. They proclaim the gospel through deliverance from evil spirits (possession) and healing from illness. These are signs of God's love and help from the things we fear most. They are evidence that God wants to restore to us what we lost in the garden. The good (gospel) is to share how God has effected this in our own lives.

We are created by God and called to great purpose. That is what the devil seeks to destroy. God, however, redeems us from what the devil did. He redeems us before we are worthy of it and then invites us to live once more in friendship with God.
