This is a momentous time. This past week the church celebrated All Saints and All Souls day. This coming week is the presidential election. The month of November is dedicated praying for the dead, as well as commemoration of all the faithful-departed (All-Souls day November 2). This provides us with the perfect opportunity to pray for our country and ask for the intercession of God's Holy Ones. The saints in Heaven and even the souls in Purgatory know our needfulness better than we do.

November 1st, we celebrated the solemnity of All Saints. People think this is a celebration of the saints like, St. Therese or St. Francis of Assisi. It is a celebration of them, but it is a celebration of all the saints. All the souls in heaven are saints. Not all the saints are canonized like St. Therese or St. Francis. They are the victors with Christ who have undergone the trial of earthly life. Accordingly, they understand our situation very well. They can see clearly to help us, and live in the presence of God so they are powerful intercessors. Everyone knows we can pray directly to Jesus. However, God wills to share his power and allows the saints to have a hand in intercession. Secondly, we often find it difficult to ask God for help directly or we feel in a particular moment closer to the saints than to God. Therefore, God acknowledges us our weakness and allows this intercession.

Unlike the celebration of All Saints Day, All Souls Day is not a holy day of Obligation. It has a different character. Whereas All Saints Day celebrates the victory of God in His Saints, All Souls Day is kind of like a funeral. In our culture, funerals are dark and heavy things because we often focus on death as separation. We often don't consider death in light of our faith, which gives hope. The focus of a Christian funeral is to celebrate and pray for the mercy of God that the dearly departed may be admitted into Heaven. We do not so much purchase their salvation as we participate with Jesus in the work of Salvation.

For all Souls Day and throughout the month of November, we repeat our prayers for all those who have died as we did on the day of their funerals. It is an act of love we offer God for our loved ones. Traditionally, we visit cemeteries on All Souls day to repair and care for tombs as well as to bless cemeteries. Perhaps it is a simple act of devotion, but it reminds us that we still have a connection with those who have died. Furthermore, our acts of devotion can help the state of souls in purgatory. Surely some prayers which we offer for particular souls are no longer needed because they have already entered Heaven. These prayers are not wasted. God takes them and uses them for souls who have no one to pray for them or who need a great number of prayers to exit Purgatory.

The souls in Purgatory offer particularly effective intercession for us. St. John Vianney said of the souls in Purgatory: "if we knew all the graces we can obtain through their intercession, they would not be so much forgotten." There are two reasons for the efficacy of their prayers. The first is gratitude. The second is that they know keenly the effects of sin, of which they are being purged, so they are anxious to help us avoid the mistakes that they made. I would imagine that sometimes it is even part of a soul's purgation to witness souls who made similar mistakes and intercede for them.

I invite you to continue to pray for our nation, now and always. "seek the welfare of the city where I have sent you into exile, and pray to the Lord on its behalf" (Jeremiah 29:7). I invite you to celebrate the glory of God revealed in the saints, and I invite you to remember always the souls in Purgatory. All of us belong to God's family. Let us remember that this November.
