

Prayer for the Holy Souls

The month of November is dedicated to praying for the souls of the dead. It is important to pray for the dead because they cannot pray for themselves. They will advance through purgatory, in time, but we can aid their journey through our prayers and sacrifice. Praying for the dead is an act of charity for our loved ones, and even for those we do not know. God is never outdone in generosity and the Holy Souls will not forget us.

There is no definitive teaching about whether souls in purgatory can pray for us before they enter heaven, but it is clear that they cannot pray for themselves. Therefore, our first duty to the souls in purgatory is one of charity. We pray for them because they cannot. Second, God sees our charity and rewards us. Thirdly, it stands to reason God will allow the Holy Souls to pray for us as we pray for them. There are many saints who hold this view. We are free to follow either belief.

My favorite example of a saint who calls for prayers for the faithfully departed is St. John Vianney who remarked, "If it were but known how great is the power of the good souls in purgatory with the heart of God, and if we knew all the graces we can obtain through their intercession, they would not be so much forgotten. We must, therefore, pray much for them, that they may pray much for us." I have found this to be true in my own life. When I started to pray the rosary every day in seminary, I would pray it after dinner walking through the abbey cemetery. I came to love praying for the souls in purgatory and hoped for their prayers. I believe I have experienced their help.

I would like to quote one other saint who believes that the souls in purgatory can pray for us. St. Alphonsus Ligouri said, "We may piously believe that God makes our prayers known to them; and then they, full of charity as they are, most assuredly do not omit to pray for us." He says 'piously believe' because there is no definitive teaching of the church. Put another way we could say "approaching this topic with faith we may believe."

When we pray for the souls in purgatory we also remember that the church is one. We are united (the church in heaven, the church on earth and the church in purgatory). We are not separated, though the connection is not readily apparent to our senses. Praying for the souls in purgatory also renews our hope in heaven.

What are the things we can do to pray for the Holy Souls? Fundamentally, any prayers or sacrifices can be offered for the souls in purgatory, especially offering the mass, attending Eucharistic Adoration and praying the Rosary. During the month of November they are a few other special prayers we can pray.

What about plenary indulgences? Basically, in the church there is a store of all the prayers that have and are being offered united to the sacrifice of Jesus. In the name of the Church, the pope can unlock these graces. Plenary indulgences are an act of the church using the prayer of the church to encourage good activity. A full plenary indulgence removes all the temporal punishment due to sin (time in purgatory) and a partial indulgence reduces the time. During the days of November 1st through November 8th anyone can obtain a plenary indulgence for visiting a cemetery. A partial indulgence can be gained throughout the year (applicable only to the souls in purgatory) for devoutly visiting a cemetery and at least mentally praying for the dead. Another way to gain partial indulgences for the souls in purgatory is to pray the prayer "Eternal Rest grant unto them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them. May the souls of the faithful departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace Amen." These are some ways to pray for the dead.

I believe if we do these things we will grow in hope for heaven. We will grow in hope that God can always intercede in our lives and I believe we will begin to find hope that we didn't expect. The Holy Souls will pray for us when we most need it but don't realize we need to pray. Even if you don't believe the holy souls can pray for you while in purgatory, they absolutely do when they arrive in heaven. God in his mercy allows this because he wills that we all work together in the work of Salvation.
