Reaching Towards Christmas

As we reach the fourth Sunday of Advent our time before Christmas grows short. Have you prepared? Are you ready to receive Christ? If not know that the world was also not ready when Jesus was born. There was, "no room at the Inn." Even Mary and Jospeh encountered difficulty. They obviously prepared, but had to leave many of these preparations because of the census. Fortunately for us, God does not wait for us to be worthy in order to act. This is at the heart of the mystery of Christmas.

Perhaps you have seen the movie *The Best Christmas Pageant Ever*. It has recently been remade by the creator of the Chosen series. In the family a church is putting on a Christmas pageant, but an unlikely family, the Herdman's, decides to take part in the pageant. They are not well-regarded by anyone. People think that they will be the ruination of the pageant. However, in the end their unlikeliness brings forward the message of Christmas in ways the people did not imagine. God's use of unlikely means is at the heart of the mystery and message of Christmas.

Advent is about preparing for Christ, but no matter what we do God is always going to outpace our preparations. Thankfully, this is part of the plan also. The Holy Family prepared, their preparations were largely undone by the census. The priests and leaders did not await or prepare for Jesus, God made it known through the Angel at Christmas and prophetically through the three wisemen. The shepherds in the field were not thought worthy to receive the King, nor the messiah, yet it was they who first received the good news of Jesus' birth. God's way is not our way and it is both surprising and wonderful to behold.

In these last hours of Advent we can still prepare our hearts. The shepherds in the field had no time to prepare. They were in the midst of their work in the fields. Shepherd's were poorly thought of because their work often rendered them ritually impure and unable to participate in the regular religious life of Israel. Despite this, the angel of the Lord appeared to them announcing "good news of a great joy" that Jesus was born. Is it the way that most people would have chosen? No, but like the Herdman's, it makes God present like no other way would. God's way is not our way.

Even if we are not prepared, we can come with humility like the shepherds who found their way by the light of the angels who rested upon the place singing, "Glory to God in the highest..." (Lk 2:14). It was there in a manger they beheld the King of Kings, and Lord of Lords. It must have been much to their surprise that he would be born in such lowly estate. Truly, would anyone but the poor shepherds have been able to receive the poor Christ child that first Christmas night?

We expect God to follow worldly expectations, like the people in the *The Best Christmas Pageant Ever* and so we often miss the glory and mystery of God. I don't think it is wrong that we look for the Christ child in the palace of the king like the Three Wisemen. However, those who lack the humility to adapt like the Wisemen will miss His coming. Herod could not perceive the meaning of the poor Christ child and so he sought to destroy him. Imagine the surprise he would have had if he could for a moment see the plan of Jesus to save even Herod. The people in the movie were not prepared to see Christ in the Heardman's, but in the end the shock of how they fittingly portrayed Christmas helped them to see it in a way they could never see before. This is the mystery and the glory of Christmas that God takes on and uses human means despite ourselves.

My brothers and sisters. The mystery of Christmas is truly beyond us, and yet it is at the same time made accessible to us. Left to ourselves we would never be able to see, but God wills to use human means that are understandable to us if only we have humility, if we can lay down our pride and preconceived notions. Christ's coming is for all, from the highest kings to the poorest poor. We need only respond to the message of the angel sent to announce to us Christ the Lord.
