Rejoice in the Lord Always

The theme of the third Sunday of Advent each year is to rejoice. What do we rejoice in? We are called to act on the hope which we have found in waiting eagerly for the Lord. This hope does not come from our circumstances, it comes from the Lord. This is the beauty and the joy of believing. God gives us what the world cannot. Christians can rejoice always, even in the midst of suffering.

As Christians, we can hope that God takes part in our lives no matter how difficult they become. In fact, often we experience God more when we suffer than when we are blessed. This is because when we are often more open to God because we know that we need Him. Mary for example saw many distressing things in the people of Israel and in the world, but she did not despair. She prayed for the coming of the Messiah.

St. Louis de Montfort said citing St. Augustin that the world was not worthy to receive Jesus (True Devotion to Mary §16). Many of the Jews stopping looking for God's promised Messiah and instead sought to make their own. There were many false messiahs who preceded Jesus. The world was not worthy or ready to receive Jesus, so God made Mary in order that the world receive Jesus through Mary. Mary was God's chosen instrument for this. It is true God saved her from original sin from before her birth, but He also chose her for her great humility (True Devotion §16). She did not think that the world would be saved through her prayers, but through the providence of God, in whom she placed all her trust.

Advent is about putting into practice the hope that we have found. It does not necessarily mean that our circumstances have changed, but our hearts know more than our intellect does. An example of this are Simeon and Ana who encounter the child Jesus in the temple. There was not a neon sign indicating that Jesus was the Christ child, but their faith recognized what their eyes did not. Likewise, as we draw near to the coming of Jesus the faith in our hearts discerns more than we can determine with our intellect alone. I am reminded of the character of the Fox in the novel The Little Prince who said, "it is only the heart that can see rightly; what is essential is invisible to the eye." It is that way in truth. What is most essential is visible to those who have faith.

I am hopeful for the future because I know the Lord. I know what He has done for me, and I know what He has historically done for his people. He is the source of my hope. Some people's hope darkens as the world does. My hope grows because I do not sense the world ending, but the nearing of the Lord to save us. He alone has the solutions to our most pressing problems. I am eager to see it because our need is great, and our Lord's mercy is greater.

At the beginning of Advent, I suggested that we needed to allow ourselves to become aware of our needfulness. This helps us to open our hearts and cry out to the Lord to save us. It is what Mary did, even though she had no sin. It is the activity of faith within us.

In the book of Revelation, the martyrs groan in anticipation of the final victory of God. They wonder how long, and God consols them and assures them. God does this in us also if we only turn to him. That's all we need to do is express our need. Let us in these last days of Advent continue to express our need. "God save us for we have sinned against you." "God save us we are lost without you." "God save me, I've been trying to do it, and I haven't the strength." "God save the world it is lost, and I can't imagine how it can change, but I've heard you can do it." Pray in these or similar words which touch your own heart.

God is not moved to obliterate us because of our sins. He does not need to punish us; our sin contains the punishment in itself. When he saw the world was not worthy or ready to receive Jesus, God sent Him anyway. It was not the time or the way we would have chosen, but it is God's way. What God is prepared to do for us is more than we can ask or imagine, but if we pray with Mary and Joseph for the coming of the Lord then we will glimpse it when we least expect it.
