

Entering Lent

We are in the last hours before Ash Wednesday and the holy season of Lent begins. Are you prepared? Fear not. God is able to use our weakness. He certainly knows about the situation of our lives. There is grace for all who want it. That is great news. If we desire to know God better through Lent. Not only will He help us, but he will provide opportunities and grace we don't even know to ask for. What is important is that we put our desire into action. Pray about it, put together a plan and review the plan as you go.

We absolutely need the practice of Lent. Our human nature weighs on us. If we don't check ourselves we fall into sin or at the very least make excuses for ourselves and fall into laxity. The devil will be happy to accept laxity over sin because he knows eventually we will fall into sin if we cease our march forward in the spiritual life. A good analogy might be that blockages form in our connection with the Lord. Lent is a time to clear out these avenues and make way for the Lord (cf. Isaiah 40:3). Through our prayer, fasting and almsgiving God prepares us for the new blessings he wants to give us come Easter.

The three children of Fatima (Lucia, Francesco, and Jacinta) exemplify a life of prayer and penance. It did not come easily or naturally. Before the Angel of Portugal appeared to them, they would say the rosary by abbreviating the Hail Mary down to 4 words so that they could finish it more quickly. When the Angel of Portugal appeared he taught them to pray and acknowledge God for who He is and making reparation for those who do not accept Him. It was a significant change in their life that took time and even error.

One time the children were playing, and the Angel appeared exclaiming, "What are you doing? You must pray! Pray!" Was their play sinful? No, but the angel understood that souls are going to hell as we Christians go their own way. The Angel sought to impress the need for prayer upon the children to help them fulfill Jesus and Mary's plans for them. Jesus teaches us through their extraordinary acts how to also embrace the cross. Lent is a time for us to answer the call of God.

We need to grow in faith in order to face the times that we are living in. Prayer, fasting, and almsgiving helps us to do so. Each of these practices help us to surrender our understanding of God. Through prayer, we learn who God is. We can supplement our prayer with the lives and writings of the saints. The lives of the saints testify to the veracity of God's word. Fasting teaches us to rely on God more than ourselves. Through regular fasting we learn how to fast better. For example, fast once a week on bread and water or through skipping a meal or something we like. It will be uncomfortable, but this helps us to remember the Lord. Think of the children of Fatima who embraced great sacrifices to save souls. Almsgiving breaks the hold that selfishness has on our hearts. We learn the God-given value of denying ourselves in order to meet the needs of our brothers and sisters.

We glory in the Lord despite ourselves. We have taken our rest long enough (Mt 26:45). Now is the time to rise and answer the call of Jesus and Mary like Lucia, Francesco, and Jacinta. May we all respond generously to the call of Jesus that we be made ready for Easter. You will not regret it. The more you embrace the spirit of prayer, fasting and almsgiving the more you will rejoice in Easter, having offered your own suffering, prayer and penance at the altar. Jesus is the one who will save the world and renew the church. We cannot. However, following Jesus through Lent prepares us to be Jesus' instruments to save the world.
