

The Beatitudes, Heavenly Wisdom for Happiness

A quick review of television, radio or our favorite social media site will reveal many things which are supposed to make us happy. Sometimes this is presented as a new product, a service, or some other enlightenment. However, deep down or from practical experience, we know that these things rarely deliver and when they do it is a short-lived happiness. As soon as we adapt to our new 'happiness,' we want something new. In the gospel, this Sunday Jesus shares the 'Beatitudes' which are his outline for obtaining true happiness. However, a review of the teachings of Jesus in the public sphere will reveal the opinion that Jesus' teachings are an obstacle to happiness. Which is the authentic path to happiness, that of the Gospel or the world?

I suspect that most committed Christians would jump to conclusion that the Gospel is the true path to happiness. That may be the case, but to hastily jump to this conclusion ignores our experience. Often we know what will make us truly happy, but we don't do it anyway. Why is this? Matthew Kelly in his book Resisting Happiness suggests this is due to resistance. The book provides a fascinating exploration of this phenomenon; however, I would like to focus on the nature of the worlds pathways to happiness and that of the Beatitudes.

The Greek word for Beatitudes literally translates as, "happy." The beatitudes read, "happy are those who..." They offer apparent contradictions. For example "Happy' are the meek, they will inherit the earth." Ordinarily, we consider those with power or who use force the ones who inherit the earth. Jesus turns our notion on its head. Jesus offers heavenly wisdom to guide our life. Some aspects of the Beatitudes we experience now on earth, and some aspects are directed towards heaven, e.g., "Blessed are they who are persecuted for the sake of righteousness, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven." None of the Beatitudes offer immediate gratification. However, they do provide longer lasting satisfaction.

The World is the king of instant gratification. You can find immediate gratification by turning on your phone and looking at your notifications, pulling up a website or even watching your favorite TV show on demand. The trouble is that as soon as this stimulation is completed, the satisfaction is also concluded leaving us empty and often desperate for continued stimulus. Jesus does not try to compete with the world. He leaves the world as it is and us to form our own conclusions. He does this because he does not need to compete. What He offers is objectively better, and He does not need us to stroke His ego. God offers us the truth and grace to accept it.

The Beatitudes reveal heavenly wisdom. The Wisdom of the Gospel is not always practical. Very often what is suggested is the opposite of what is practical, and yet it proves true. We know it is true because it is revealed by God who is all and only good. Jesus invites us then to experience reality as it is, even when the authentic truth seems strange to us. He leaves it up to us whether or not we want to accept this.

The Beatitudes offer the path to true happiness. However, we often resist what we know is truly good. It is necessary, therefore to ask for God's help to be truly happy, to overcome our resistance. God is a truly patient teacher who takes great pains to help us to do this, but I have found the quickest way to overcome our faults is through the Mother of God. Let us turn to Mary, our Mother and ask her to help us 'poor banished children of Eve.' She perfectly lived the Beatitudes in her life, and with her life, we shall better emulate them in our lives and enjoy eternal happiness with her in Heaven.
