CCC 336. From its beginning until death, human life is surrounded by [the angels'] watchful care and intercession. Beside each believer stands an angel as protector and shepherd leading him to life. Already here on earth the Christian life shares by faith in the blessed company of angels and men united in God.

In the first reading this Sunday from the book of Exodus, Moses is at low point in his life. He went from a candidate for high-office in the royal court of Egypt, to an exile. In exile he was working as a shepherd one of the lowliest jobs he could have had given considering his previous office. It seemed that Mosses was on the outs, and yet it was at this moment that God spoke to him. It is as good an example as any that God doesn't choose the qualified, He qualifies the chosen. It is also a reminder that God sees our situation very differently than we do, and God's evaluation is more true.

God wants to have an individual encounter with each of us. He chooses the time and manner of this encounter not according to our fancy, but according to our true needs. He knows us better than we know our selves and acts to reveal to us our heart of hearts. I'm sure it seemed as strange to Moses that God would show up under such circumstances. God surprises us because He is mysterious, but also because we fail to appreciate that God truly has our best interests at heart. We expect that God will act like human beings looking out for themselves.

When God spoke to Moses he was responding to the cries of the people. "I have seen the affliction of my people who are in Egypt...I know their sufferings and I have come down to deliver them" (Exodus 3:8). God is speaking to Moses not only for Moses's own sake, but for the sake of Moses's people. It is one of the most striking passages in all of scripture. So many things happen in this one instant. So often we accuse God of delay or of not understanding our request. The reality is, He is making preparations for a moment that will change everything. We do not understand before God reveals the plan, but we will understand later.

Lent reminds us that we must prepare for encountering God. Before mass we fast for an hour, examine our conscience and prepare our spiritual sacrifices. Elijah in the dessert wandered for 40 days before encountering God on Mt. Horeb. Jesus goes into the dessert for 40 days before beginning his ministry. When we look at the lives of the saints, we find this also. For example, in the lives of visionaries like Sr. Lucia, St. Francesco and St. Jacinta they are prepared for their encounter with heaven by an angel. The angel teaches them to pray. The angel teaches them to adore God. The angel teaches them to make reparation. Only after this time of preparation are they ready to receive a vision from Heaven. Even then Our Lady tells Francesco that he needs to pray many rosaries. Through Lent we renew our preparation for God which may have grown lax.

As the day that God appeared to Moses seemed the most unlikely, it is the same for us. Pope John Paul was once asked what the most important day of his life was. You would imagine his response would be the day that he was made pope, or when he helped with the fall of communism or some other accomplishment of his papacy. His response was surprising. It was the day of his baptism. Why would Pope St. John Paul II so revere this day above all others? For the same reason that Moses revealed the day of the burning bush. It was the moment God began a new relationship.

Baptism is one of the most defining moments of our lives. If you were an adult when you were baptized you prepared many days for it. The church would have also prayed for you as the date of your baptism approached. Even if you were an infant, your parents are entrusted the task of unpacking the grace of your baptism. All of us have the opportunity to prepare in Lent for when we renew our baptismal promises on Easter Sunday. We gather together acknowledging with thanksgiving what God has done for us, and what effect He has had on us. We are not baptized again, but we are renewed in God's grace.

We are all renewed in Easter, but the fruitfulness of this renewal depends on our preparation. In the remaining weeks of Lent let us re-double our efforts of prayer, fasting and almsgiving. Let us ask our guardian angels to assist us in our preparations.
