Emergency calls are answered immediately; call office for Holy Communion or Anointing of the Sick.



## Divine Mercy Sunday

Vespers at 5:30 after Saturday Mass.

Sunday exposition before the 10:30 Mass from 9:30 - 10:30. The Rosary and the Chaplet of the Divine Mercy will be recited.



"They found the stone rolled away from the tomb, but when they went in they did not find the body...they were perplexed about this." Luke 24:2-4

We do not often consider that the disciples of Jesu were not rejoicing on that first Easter morning. They were preparing spices to better anoint the body of Jesus than they could before the Sabath. They were looking for a body, and instead found an empty tomb with angels heralding proclamations, "Why do you seek the living among the dead? [Jesus] is not here, but has been risen." Their faith was too small to anticipate the resurrection, with the possible exception of Mary. They struggled to understand.

Many of you have expressed confusion, or even anger at my move to Washington. Just remember that in Jesus' time with the Apostles also ended before they thought that it would. They felt sadness, their own lack and sinfulness. They only imagined that forever all they would have left would be Jesus' tomb. It was the end. It was darkness. It was despair. Judas despaired so much of his sin that he took his own life. What could they expect, only faith can pierce the early light of the resurrection.

The crucifixion to our earthly eyes is merely an end. Holy Saturday always seems so quiet, so still, hardly a bird chirping over the whole earth. It is easy to imagine the apostles imagining how things could have or even should have been different. All the while the earth rested, and Jesus' body remained in the tomb. We all ponder difficult things like the death of Jesus, choices that we make or tragedies we have experienced. The questions that arise in our hearts rarely provide the answers we really need. However, Holy Saturday is not an end. It is an in-between. All will be revealed.

The Hebrew word that we get the word Paschal from, refers to a leap. It's the transition from Good Friday to Easter Sunday. The human mind cannot pierce it. Only faith can. Jesus completely abandon's himself to the Father's will unto death. We fear to do so even a little. This trust, this surrender is the stuff that pierces the veil that separate us. The leap of faith alone can take us from the Cross on Good Friday to the joy of the Resurrection Sunday. In-between lies Holy Saturday which sometimes seems more difficult than Good Friday. It is quiet. It alone. It seems useless. However, our frail human nature needs this to jar us into an act of faith that gets us the rest of the way.

In the early hours of Easter, the Apostles were still overcome with grief. It took time for them to come to grips with the reality of Jesus risen, but when they did...marvelous things happened. They took the gospel to the ends of the earth. They were willing to suffer the loss of all because of what they found in Jesus, and what they did not expect for themselves. Mary Magdalen, the first witness of the resurrection, did not recognize Jesus until He called her by name. The apostles initially doubted her story. They had to let go of their preconceived expectations in order for God to open their hearts to the truth that was readily before them.

My brothers and sisters. I do not know what will come to the parish after I depart. It is beyond what I can ascertain through reason. However, I recall that while I have been pastor, truly I am only the steward. Jesus alone is the true pastor of the parish and he remains so. It is difficult for us to adjust and see what he is doing, but we will in time as we accept what Jesus is revealing. In these next 40 days of Easter let us ask the apostles to help us open ourselves to the divine reality which Jesus is revealing. He has a plan for us, that he is only just beginning to reveal.
