Emergency calls are answered immediately; call office for Holy Communion or Anointing of the Sick.



"It is necessary for us to undergo many hardships to enter the kingdom of God." Acts 14:22

St. Paul says in the first reading that it is necessary to suffer to enter into the Kingdom of God. It would seem that Paul is saying that God wants us to suffer. That is not the case. For one thing, people who are not Christians also suffer. The difference is that Christians suffer with hope because of Jesus. Who in your life wants to suffer when they could avoid it? Jesus could have avoided all of his sufferings, but he chose not to. Jesus' choice to suffer willingly for our sake is what changes everything.

Why is there suffering in the world? This is a difficult question to answer. The simple theological answer is because of sin. It was our choice to sin, and our choice brought with it the consequence of suffering and death. This was not God's choice nor his creation, but rather a distortion of his creation. We struggle with this answer for the same reason we sinned in the first place. The devil convinced us that God does not want what is good for us. However, God knows our weaknesses and sent His son to suffer all the things that we do in order to demonstrate God's faithfulness to us. We avoid what is difficult, thinking it best. Jesus chooses to endure many difficulties, including suffering and death for our sake even though he does not have to. Despite his suffering, Jesus lived the fullest possible life. He shows us the way to God through His fidelity to the Father. At the pinnacle of this witness is Jesus' trust in God the Father despite facing death, and that God the Father did not abandon Him.

We rarely consider the positive effects of Jesus' suffering. If God himself chose to suffer, does that not affect the nature of suffering? Think of it this way. If God chose to suffer, there must be some hidden goodness? God demonstrates his ability to make good come from suffering through Jesus' suffering and death. Consequently, all suffering is changed through Jesus' own suffering. When we suffer with Jesus, our suffering can take part in Jesus' saving sacrifice. Jesus says through his suffering, "Behold I make all things new." With Jesus, our own suffering can make things new.

How can we live the truth about God and suffering in our lives? First, we can pray to experience God in the midst of suffering. We all suffer. Do we cry out to God in our need? When we cry out to God in our need, do we really believe that he will answer? Sometimes God answers, but we do not recognize his answer for what it is. For example, in an extreme situation, we do not seem to be getting a response. However, we have a peace that comes over us. Does the peace come from the material circumstances? Probably not. If we are greatly distressed, is it likely that the peace came from ourselves? Again, probably not. God gives us the gift of himself, and he helps us. He meets us in our suffering and does not run from it.

My brothers and sisters, the problem of suffering is a difficult mystery to endure. Let us pray that we all become aware of God's presence in our lives so that we may already know how to trust and correspond with him before suffering enters our lives. When it does, may Mary lead us as she did the apostle John at the foot of the Cross.

May 18, Pope Saint John I
