Emergency calls are answered immediately; call office for Holy Communion or Anointing of the Sick.



What does it mean to "live the Faith?" Living the Faith is something that we are all called to do. I imagine for many, "living the faith" conjures images of different activities to perform. However, living the Faith is not reducible to actions. Living the Faith is first a relationship with God who leads us to action. In the gospel this Sunday, Jesus relates that his sheep hear his voice, know his voice and follow Him. In the first reading from the Acts of the Apostles, we see an example of what living faith looks like.

I remember in Seminary one of my fellow seminarians asked if I knew how federal agents were trained to discover counterfeit bills. He explained that they spend so much time with real currency that anything else is readily apparent. This is the heart of the message which Jesus shares in the gospel. We learn from our relationship with Jesus. The more time we spend with Him, the more we experience him and the easier for us to recognize counterfeit truth. Jesus becomes the measure of our life.

We could make a dichotomy about someone who talks about Jesus and someone who knows Jesus. In today's reading from Acts, we see that the whole city gathered to hear Paul. This is an example of someone who knows Jesus. It does not always mean an entire city gathers to listen, but that those who do gather are captivated. They discover something they have found nowhere else. Note that Jesus was speaking to Jews in the Synagogue. In other words, they are people already familiar with God, and yet they find in Paul's words something new. Let's examine what is new.

What is the difference between someone who knows about God and someone who knows God? In my experience, someone who knows their topic and is an excellent speaker excites the ears. Listening to them is pleasant. They keep our attention. Someone who is not a good speaker or is unprepared leaves us fidgety and disturbed. It is not pleasant. Listening to someone who speaks in the Spirit of God is a totally different experience. Sometimes their words are not exciting, but they still move our hearts. Paul says that he does not preach with lofty words, but the Wisdom of the Cross. In other words, the substance of Paul's preaching is not *what*, but *who*. Jesus is the message, and he is literally present in Paul's words. This is not something you can learn, but you can experience it and through the power of the Spirit of God share with others.

The Easter season is a reminder that we are a people who live by faith. This faith is based on a relationship. Who the apostles were after Pentecost was a direct result of their contact with Jesus and the Holy Spirit. God wants the same for us. He wants to lead us. He wants to sit with us in our suffering. He wants to show us how He did not will us to suffer, but that He is capable of bringing good out of misery. Unlike other people, He does not offer this as a suggestion, but through His own suffering for us. We, like the apostles before Pentecost, underestimate just how much a part of our lives Jesus wants to be. If you knew someone who knew everything ugly about you and still wanted to be with you, who witnessed your sufferings and sat with you through them accepting your sufferings as their own, would you not want to know such a person? That person is Jesus. Through Easter Jesus revealed to the Apostles what they could not understand before they witnessed the Crucifixion. Now Jesus wants to share the same with us. Let us ask for the grace to receive it.
