Pentecost

Now is the time of Pentecost. We have celebrated the 40 days of Easter, witnessed the Ascension of Jesus, and felt our own lack without Jesus. Now God the Father sends us the Spirit as Jesus promised. The Holy Spirit aids us in our weakness. He fills our lack so that we can live the Christian life we are called to. However, in my experience, the Holy Spirit is often greatly limited by the limits we place upon him. We do not allow Him to operate to the full in us.

Who is the Holy Spirit? He is the third person of the Holy Trinity. He is God. He is not a force in the world, or energy. He is God, one with the Father and the Son. Admittedly, He seems more abstract to us than either Jesus or God the Father. Jesus came to reveal God to us. It is natural that we more easily relate to Jesus because He became man. However, Jesus also came to reveal to us God the Father. We do not see God the Father in the way that we see Jesus, but through our experience of Jesus, we come to experience God the Father.

Jesus informs us about the Holy Spirit. He says that He will send us the Advocate. He comes to us in our weakness. He convicts us of sin. He reminds us of teaching and reveals to us teaching we had not known. The Holy Spirit proceeds from the Father and the Son. The Holy Spirit is most mysterious to us because we observe Him most through His work in us. He acts spiritually within us, and often we do not recognize Him because we are not paying attention or do not believe God would work in us.

I remember how I became more familiar with the Holy Spirit. First was recognizing my need for healing. It was after spending much time in prayer that I became more open to hearing God's voice and recognized I needed to grow more than I knew how. Before I recognized him, the Holy Spirit arranged all that I needed to receive further healing and to experience the Holy Spirit. What was needed from me was to accept the promptings God was sending me. The best I could describe it was that I felt "prompted" or "led" to understand I needed to grow more. When I surrendered to what God was saying, he gradually showed me where I needed to get there and people to assist me. Put another way, all that God required was my "yes" to what He was doing in my soul. God provided the rest.

Who is the Holy Spirit to us? The Holy Spirit acts throughout our lives. I remember when I first more directly experienced the Holy Spirit, a priest was praying with me. He asked if I felt the Holy Spirit. It's hard to describe. I felt a movement in my heart, not a physical sensation but a movement within. I didn't recognize it until the priest questioned me some more. He helped me identify this movement of the Holy Spirit. I say this to highlight that the Holy Spirit usually does not shout. We need to be quiet and looking for his response. He is clear, but we need to be listening. The more we cooperate with the Holy Spirit, the more readily we will recognize his voice even in the midst of noise.

Jesus did not leave the apostles orphans. Nor does he orphan us. He sends us the Holy Spirit. The trouble is how hard we strive to find solutions without God or even try to exclude God. As we exclude God, disorder, chaos, and suffering increase. God has solutions to our problems if we only ask. What is needed is confidence in our prayer and trusting God's response even if it differs greatly from what you expected.

Brothers and sisters, I have only three more weekends in the parish. You may feel uncertain about this. I certainly have my own human foibles regarding this. However, what you can be certain of is that the Holy Spirit is present. The Holy Spirit is using you, me, and Fr. Stephen. He is crafting something that we cannot imagine. Please join me in praying for Fr. Stephen, that he will be open to the promptings of the Holy Spirit. I am praying that the Holy Spirit send his graces to help you through this time. Please also pray for me as I go where the Lord sends me.
